Hello, I am opposed to the development in that I am told that some mature Fir trees would have to come out, plus, I do believe that there is an Eagle habitat nearby and Eagles are a protected species, plus, I believe there is a Wetland Category III within half a mile of the proposed development.

I am also concerned as the developer wants to build on a steep slope, about the impacts to flooding and erosion to the neighboring properties and to the wetland below and am concerned with the water runoff and with adversely impacting the critical areas and put the area at more risk of a landslide.

And would they need to put up a retaining wall and if so, would that cause the removal of trees?

And how high is the property going to go and will it impact the views of any neighbors?
