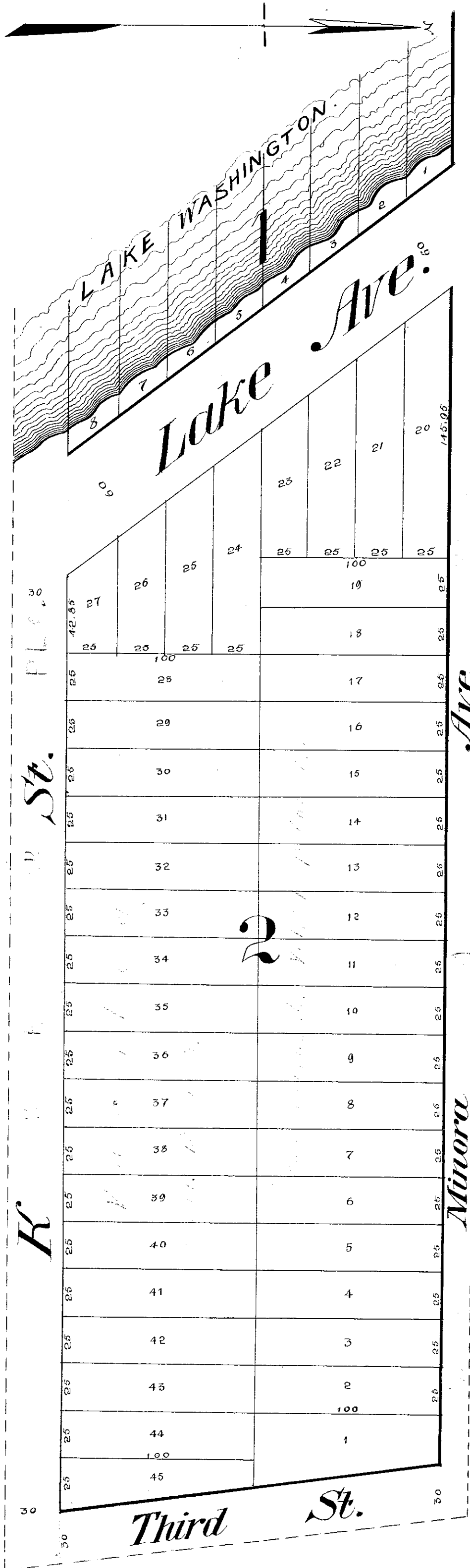


Kibbe's Addition TO EAST SEATTLE.

DESCRIPTION.

This plat of "Kibbe's Addition To East Seattle" embraces all that portion of tract 22 Harry White's plat of East Seattle Acre Tracts (Recorded in Vol. 3 of plats page 36 Auditors Records of King County, Washington) lying south of a straight line, parallel to the southern boundary of said tract 22, and passing through the North West corner of said tract 22, at the intersection of J and Third street. H street and Third street are each 30 feet wide in this Addition and the South line of H Street and the East line of Third street are the South and East lines respectively of said tract 22. Lake Ave. is 60 feet wide and Minor Ave. is as shown hereon. Sizes of lots are as shown hereon, and water lots run to deep water.

DEDICATION.

Know all men by these Presents: that we, George R. Kibbe and Minora E. Kibbe, his wife, owners in fee simple of the above described "Kibbe's Addition To East Seattle" hereby declare this plat and hereby dedicate to the use of the public forever as highways all the Streets and Avenues, as platted hereon. 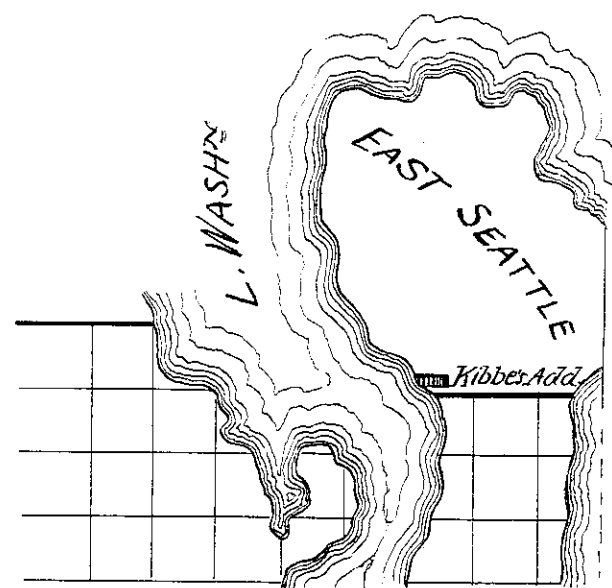
