Pursuant to this notice, the dog listed above will be considered a "Potentially Dangerous Dog" under MICC 7.04.020 and RCW 16.08.070 twenty (20) days after service of this notice on 7/30/23. This notice places immediate restrictions upon the dog listed above and requires your immediate action. Contact Regional Animal Services of King County at 206-263-1314 if you have any questions.

Declaration of Potentially Dangerous Dog

Regional Animal Services of King County has probable cause to believe that the dog listed above falls within the definition of potentially dangerous dog as set forth in MICC 7.04.020 and RCW 16.08.070 for the following reason(s):

- The dog listed above has inflicted a bite or bites on a human, domestic animal, or livestock on public or private property.
- The dog listed above chased or approached a person or person upon the streets, sidewalks, or any public ground or private property in a menacing fashion or apparent attitude of attack.
- The dog listed above has a known propensity, tendency, or disposition to attack unprovoked, to cause injury, or to cause injury or otherwise to threaten the safety of humans or domestic animals.

During the 20 days before this declaration is effective, on or before 8/19/23, you may appeal this notice. Information on how to appeal this notice follows.

The facts which support this declaration are as follows:

This declaration is based on the following:

MICC 7.04.020 *Potentially Dangerous Dog...* "any dog that when unprovoked (a) inflicts bites on a human or a domestic animal either on public or private property..."

RCW 16.08.070 1(a) *Potentially dangerous dog*" means any dog that when unprovoked: (a) inflicts bites on a human or a domestic animal either on public or private property..."


Regional Animal Services of King County received a formal complaint form from the bite victim that included supplemental photos of an unprovoked dog to human bite that occurred on 7/22/23 at approximately 1530 in the dog owner's home. The bite did break skin on the victim. The victim of the bite was attempting to greet the dog in question when it suddenly jumped up onto her and bit her on the stomach, just above the belly button. This incident resulted in three distinct puncture wounds. The victim's story is corroborated by security camera footage sent in by the dog owner that shows the incident of the dog jumping on the victim and contacting them physically.

The bite victim was allowed on the property of the dog owner by the dog owner at the time of the bite for business purposes. This incident meets the criteria aforementioned in this section under MICC 07.04.020 and RCW 16.08.070 1(a).

The statutory and municipal code basis for the proposed action are as follows:

Appeal Procedures

MICC 7.04.235 governs appeals of potentially dangerous dog declarations or dangerous dog declarations.

A notice of appeal must be filed with the Mercer Island City Clerk within 20 days of receiving a potentially dangerous dog declaration or final dangerous dog determination (notices that are mailed will be presumed to have been delivered three days after placing the notice in the mail for delivery). No fee is required to file a notice of appeal. If the owner does not file a timely written request for hearing, the restrictions imposed in connection with the potentially dangerous dog declaration or final dangerous dog determination shall remain in effect for the life of the animal, unless sooner lifted by action of the animal control authority or a court of competent jurisdiction.

Form of Appeal. An appeal shall be written and shall conform substantially to the following requirements:

1. A caption reading: "Appeal of ____," giving the names of all appellants participating in the appeal;
2. A brief statement setting forth the legal interest of each of the appellants;
3. A brief statement of the specific action appealed, together with any material facts claimed to support the contentions of the appellant(s);
4. A brief statement of the relief sought, and the reasons why the potentially dangerous dog declaration or final dangerous dog determination should be reversed, modified, or otherwise set aside;
5. Signatures of all parties named as appellants, and their official mailing addresses; and
6. Certification (by signature of the appellant(s)) that to the best of the appellant(s)' knowledge, information, and belief, the appeal is well grounded in fact.

Potentially Dangerous Dog Owner Responsibilities

Pursuant to MICC 7.04.120(E), it is unlawful for an owner of a potentially dangerous dog to permit the dog to be allowed or permitted to run free and physically unrestrained or off leash or not otherwise under physical restraint, unless within a fenced yard or similar restraint reasonably designed to prevent the dog from running free and physically unrestrained. The top of such fence must be **at least** six feet in height as measured from the ground level, unless there is a secured top—full enclosure—to the fenced-in area. Further, such fence or enclosure area must comply with all applicable city codes. Please note that a dog solely under voice and/or signal control shall be considered to be “physically unrestrained.” Any person who violates MICC 7.04.120(E) shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Pursuant to MICC 7.04.120(F), the owner of a potentially dangerous dog is responsible for taking measures to ensure that the dog does not escape the above restraints.

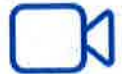

On 07-25-23 I, Officer Shepherd, called and spoke with the reporting party and bite victim, Maria Toro. M. Toro explained that she had been at the residence of J. Greenfield and his wife to provide massage services to them. She said that the dog in question, BUSTER, was confined to what she described to be the library room of the home where the dog was already initially barking at her upon entry into the home. She mentioned being familiar with dogs because she is a dog walker and that she had treats to help the dog warm up to her.

At the end of the massage session, M. Toro said that she got to do meet and greet with BUSTER. Upon J. Greenfield opening the door to the library room, BUSTER was described to have pushed past the dog owner and jumped up on her. She said this is when she was bitten on the stomach area, just above her belly button. Photos of the bite were submitted by M. Toro and uploaded to content manager. M. Toro claimed that, at first, the owners seemed to try to blow her off regarding the bite when it was brought up to them.

M. Toro said she self treated the bite including cleaning and bandaging. She said she will be making an appointment with urgent care to likely get her tetanus shot done.

The dog owners provided BUSTER's vaccination records that indicated he is up to date on his rabies vaccinations through June 7th of 2025. I called and confirmed this to be accurate through Crossroads Vet Clinic.

I walked M. Toro through the process moving forward and advised her that there would likely be further violations associated with the incident that I would update her on once I interviewed the dog owner.

At 1318 hours on 7-25-23, I attempted phone contact with the dog owner listed in Chameleon: Jeff Greenfield. There was no response, so I left a voicemail requesting a call back to discuss the matter further. I then went to the Greenfield residence at 8014 AVALON PL, MERCER ISLAND, WA and did a door knock. I could hear a dog barking in the backyard area of the residence at this time. There was no response to my door knock, so I posted a door hanger requesting contact and I also posted the quarantine notice to the door.

I missed a call and received a voicemail from J. Greenfield at 1621 about my posting and voicemail. I called him back and we discussed the incident from the perspective of himself and his wife. He corroborated that M. Toro was at their residence on 7/22/23 to provide massage services. J. Greenfield said that his dog had been barking at M. Toro, but said he was surprised to find out that there was a bite that occurred. He said that the entire interaction with M. Toro was pleasant and that she showed no sign of being injured or hurt. J. Greenfield was willing to share video footage from a security camera that is in his home so I could review the incident further.

In the meantime, J. Greenfield advised he would comply with the bite quarantine that I had posted to their door. From here, I let him know I would follow up once a determination was made on how I would be moving forward.

Upon reviewing the video footage of the incident, there is one clip where BUSTER jumps up onto M. Toro with his front legs. After that, M. Toro can be seen placing one hand over the stomach area where the bite would have been. She does appear to remain pleasant with the residents and seemingly unaffected until she leaves the residence, as seen in the videos.

Your responsibilities while your pet is under a 10 day Quarantine Order*

1) Securely confine your pet to make sure it cannot escape or get lost

- Restrict your pet to the premises of the owner or caretaker in a secure manner so as to prevent escape.
- Do not leave the pet loose in the yard. It must be kept in the house or in a securely-fenced locked kennel which is not accessible to other animals or to people other than the caregiver.
- Do not take the pet on vacation, on trips (except for veterinary care), to parks, or on walks off the owner's property.

2) Prevent any contact between the pet and people or other animals

- Your pet should have no contact with pets outside the household.1(for example, with dogs belonging to friends or neighbors) or with wild animals.
- The pet should be cared for by a responsible adult and should not be in contact with any other adults or children.

3) Observe your pet daily and report any sign of illness or abnormal behavior

- You are required to observe the animal daily during the quarantine. You must report any illness or abnormal behavior immediately to the Public Health Veterinarian at (206) 263-8454 so the animal can be checked for signs of rabies.
- If the signs of rabies are present, the Public Health Veterinarian will ask that the pet be immediately examined by a veterinarian.

4) Failure to comply and enforcement

- The Director of Public Health is authorized to request assistance from Animal Care and Control or police officers to enforce rabies control measures. If you do not comply with the above requirements it may result in the seizure of your pet and impounding at an Animal Control facility for quarantine at your expense.

5) You may not sell, give away or have your pet euthanized (put to sleep) during the quarantine period.

6) If you are unable to uphold these requirements, call the Public Health Veterinarian's office at (206) 263-8454 to discuss alternative arrangements.

**NOTE: A Quarantine Order applies to dogs, cats or ferrets that have bitten a person. The purpose of the quarantine is to assure that the animal was not carrying rabies virus at the time of the bite. These regulations are contained in Title 8 of the Code of the King County Board of Health.*

Hi Officer Shepherd,

I'm following up from our earlier conversation regarding the alleged bite from my dog, Buster. As I mentioned, my fiancée and I were both present during all of Maria's interactions with Buster and there is footage of the entire interaction. I simply don't believe there was a bite. He clearly snapped at her, but I don't see any place that he made contact, she never mentioned anything at the time, no physical or audible reaction to anything, and no marks on any of her clothes or extremities in the video. The conversation at the end was on whether we were interested in her providing dog walking services, feeding him treats by hand, letting him lick her face and laughing - I just don't see how any of those conversations and mannerisms could have ensued after a bite. We were shocked, to say the least, to hear her claim that she was bit when we got a text from her later that night. Even if there was adrenaline, as you mentioned, then I'd imagine there would have been some physical reaction to get it flowing, but I don't see any in the videos.

The links below are to the video files. They are direct from Ring, but I did notice that the one video where Buster made a move gets frozen on the download, but it is clear on my screen, so I took a screenshot and sent that in an additional link from my Amazon Photos account.

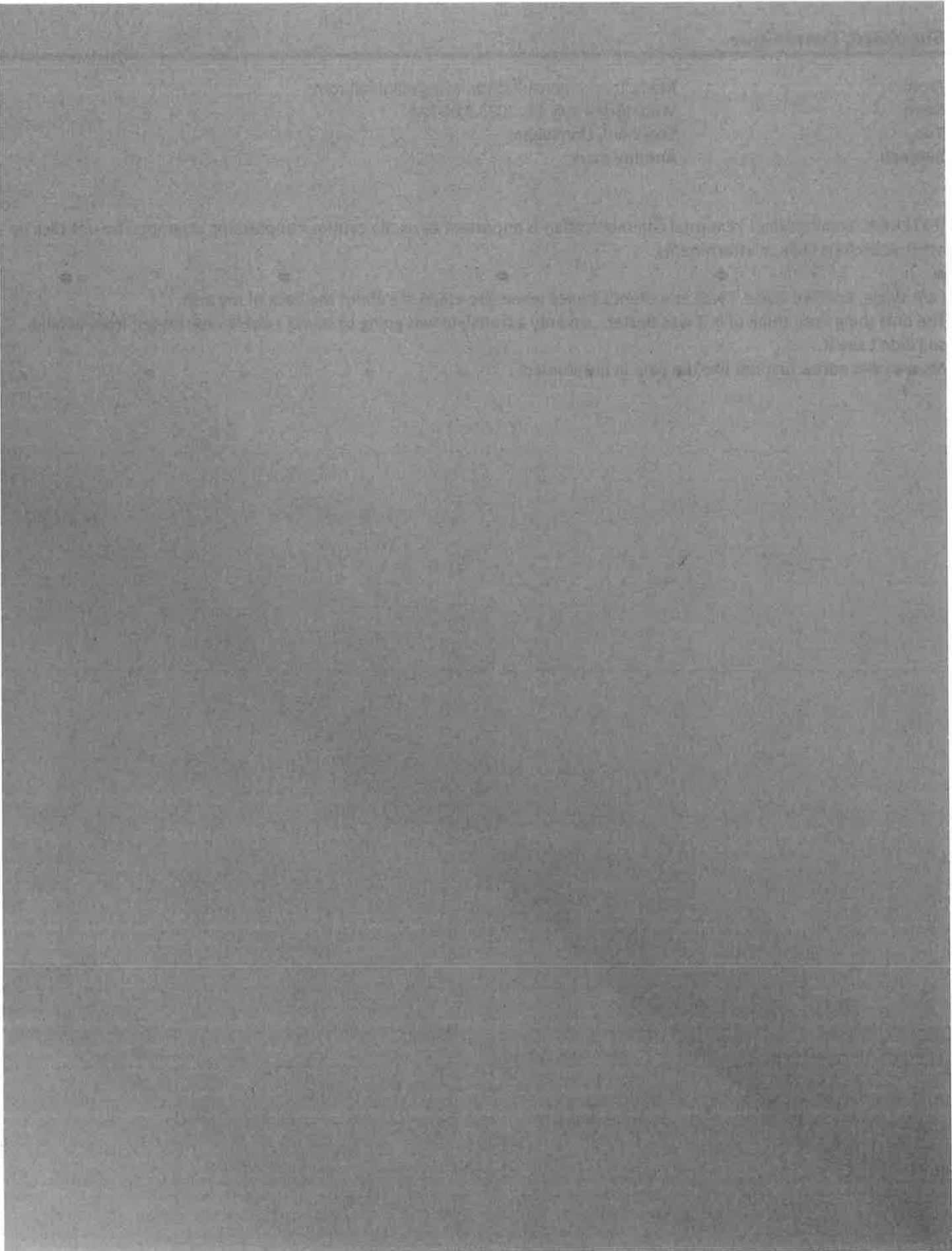

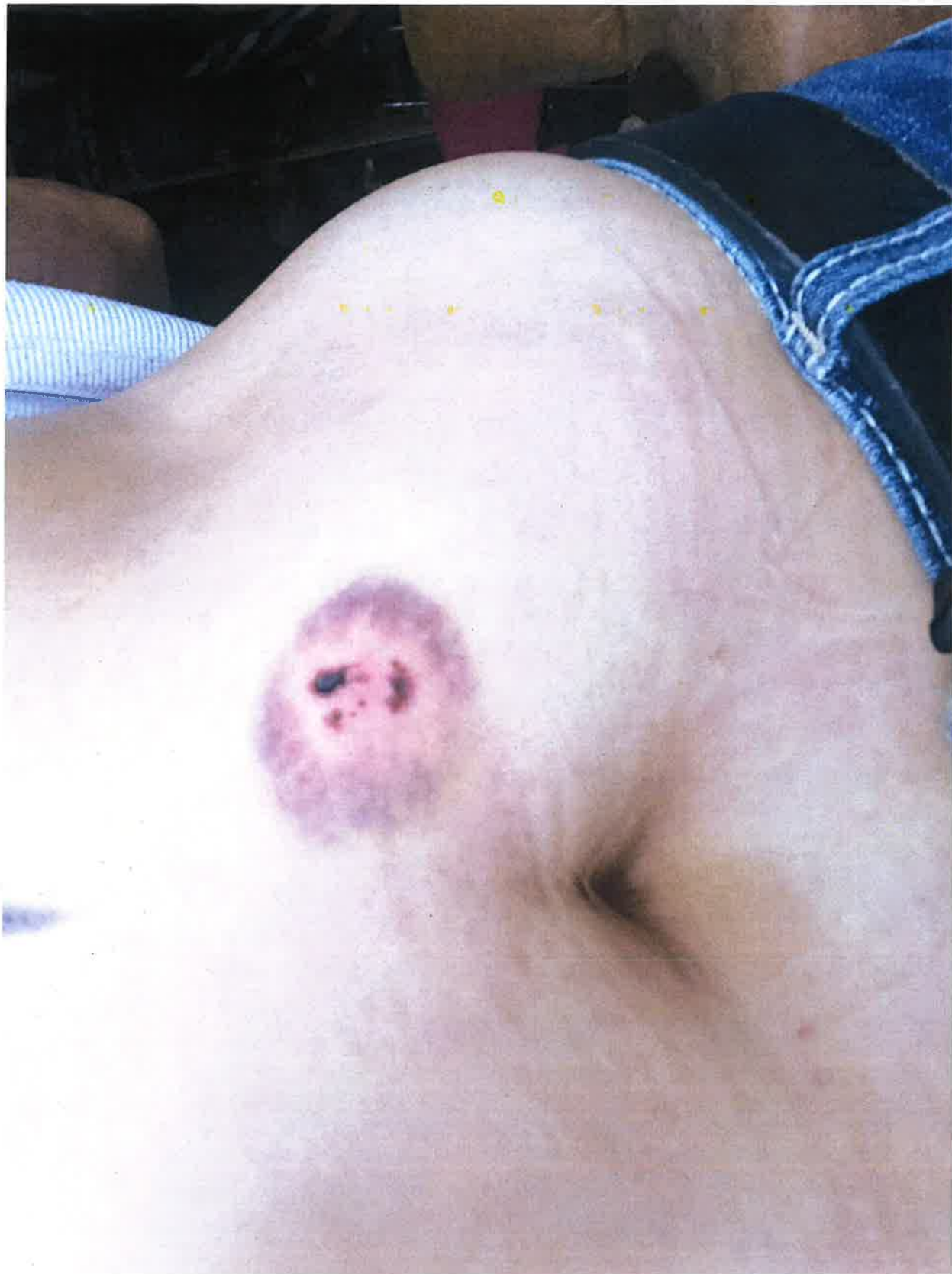

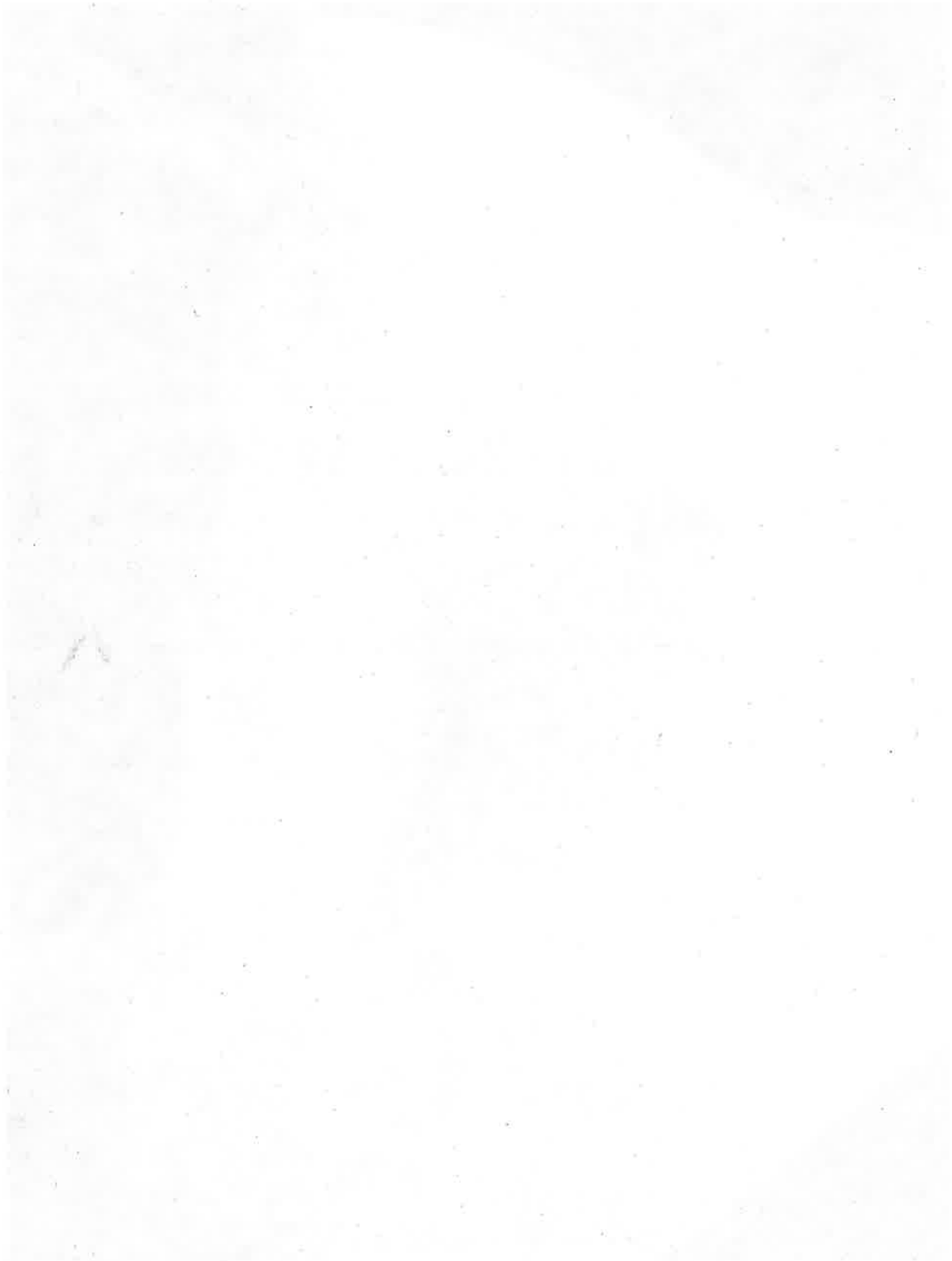
