1 a) Resume Experience: Officer Allison Wilcox began employment with King County
2 in October 2006 as an Animal Control Officer working at the Kent Animal Shelter.
3 In 2013 Officer Wilcox transitioned to the field working as an Animal Control
4 Officer.

5 In 2008 Officer Wilcox completed the Washington State Criminal Justice Training
6 Commission Animal Control Academy 80-hour course. With that completion she
7 became a certified Washington Animal Control Officer. Officer Wilcox had also
8 completed National Animal Control and Humane Officer Academy Module A and
9 B, through Colorado State University. This course completion designated Officer
10 Wilcox as a National Certificated Animal Control Officer through Colorado State
11 University. Other certificates of training include Washington State Criminal Justice
12 Training Commission Animal Cruelty Investigation course. Pasado Safe Haven six-
13 hour Body Condition scoring workshop under the direction of Dr. Elizabeth Hardy,
14 DVM. Code Three Associates and Colorado State Certificate; Warrants for Animal
15 Law enforcement Officers. Washington State Criminal Justice Training
16 Commission Law enforcement Digest. HSUS Illegal Animal Fighting, by Eric
17 Sakach HSUS Law enforcement Specialist. Officer Wilcox has completed several
18 online training courses to further her education.
